RCMP weekly report

The Merritt RCMP weekly report contains information about Court outcomes.

Guilty to firearms charges
 On Nov. 2, Mr. Christopher Skidmore pleaded guilty to Possessing a Firearm without a license and Careless Storage of a Firearm, after allegedly discharging a firearm during an apparent neighbour dispute in January this year in Kane Valley.

Mr. Skidmore received a Conditional Sentence Order for 6 months, followed by 18 months of probation, a 10 year mandatory firearms prohibition and a \$200 victim surcharge.

Guilty after a crime spree
 On November 4, 2021, Mr. Michael Lazaruk pleaded guilty to Flight from Police, Carry a Concealed Weapon and Theft of a Motor Vehicle, stemming from a crime spree that occurred in April, 2021, which began in the Logan Lake Library parking lot. Mr. Lazaruk was sentenced to 180 days in jail and probation for 1 year.

Guilty to theft under \$5000

On April 2, this year, Merritt RCMP received a report that a female had stolen a wallet from a parked vehicle in the 2300 block of Nicola Ave. Front line officers responded and were able to identify the female from surveillance footage. The female was arrested a short time later, the wallet was located in her possession and returned to its owner.

On November 2, Ms. Ramona Michel pleaded guilty to theft under \$5000. She was given a suspended sentence and probation for 9 months.

Letter to the editor Is there anybody out there????

Remembrance Day reminds us of freedoms paid for by many Canadian lives in two world wars and numerous other conflicts. As Canadians we have overcome our fears and served our country when the outcome was far from certain. Those who have served and all Canadians have been educated from a young age that this was necessary to protect basic rights and freedoms.

The question I have for Canadians now, is this just a historical theme? Do we from time to time need to ask if we are still concerned with these basic rights, valued for generations? These past eighteen months has been confusing, fear filled and stressful. Great division has been created between vaxxed and unvaxxed in more recent months. As a concerned Canadian I find myself asking many questions that have unsatisfactory answers.

The most important question I would ask fellow citizens is, have we significantly changed since this pandemic? Do we still value our historical rights and freedoms?

As we move into our winter months, it might be a good time to reflect on where we have been and where we are headed. History can be a useful guide for future outcomes.

In 2020 Essential workers in Healthcare, Emergency Services and Policing were honoured with the banging of pots and pans at 7pm with drive by parades all over the country. Now some of these same workers are being fired for making a decision not to be vaccinated. Hero to zero in 12 months. Seems pretty crazy, or am I the only one? Have a look at "Mounties for Freedom Open Letter"

It appears firing workers is the reward for 18 months of overwork. Is anybody questioning what the unintended (or intended) consequences of these policies are?

If 5% of Healthcare workers are fired and 5-10 % quit due to burnout are you going to be cared for when you need a medical attention?

I can't remember a time when you went to seek health care for an illness and were told to go home till it gets worse, delaying any treatment until your symptoms are severe. As more breakout cases of vaccinated citizens take place, is this still the right policy? Other countries use early treatment for Covid 19 with up to 10 World Health Organization (WHO) approved medicines, with successful results. How about the next generation of Canadians? With 90% of people in BC vaccinated, are we safe enough to hold off on vaccinating 5 year olds until we get some long term data?

Way back when I grew up it was accepted to have robust and diverse discussions on matters of importance like government policies that erode at basic freedoms ie: vaccine passports. We don't have to agree but the process encourages respect for other points of view. Covid 19 has been declared a public health emergency, but some past emergency policy decisions have left a stain on our country. The War Measures Act interned Japanese Canadians, confiscated their property and removed their right to make a living.

Presently we are grieving with Residential school survivors, another significant government policy. Turning a blind eye to that policy didn't make us a prouder nation. It is time to ask some of these hard questions and have those uncomfortable conversations with fellow Canadians.

Coho salmon enumeration activities

Coldwater River at Voght Park

— Until late November —

This project occurs annually in partnership with Fisheries and Oceans Canada and provides important information on Interior Fraser Coho. Coho are counted as they pass through a trap box and with the use of sonar. Migrating Coho that enter the trap box are sampled before being released upstream to continue their migration. Data collected includes length, sex, and origin (hatchery versus natural). Handling the fish also provides an opportunity to assess their overall health. The study design and operational procedures ensure minimal disruption to Coho migration and aim to reduce stress as much as possible. The majority of Coho migrate past the site unimpeded, through an opening in the fence, and are captured by the sonar unit. The injury rate of fish in the trap is very low; less than 0.2% of fish, on average, passing through the site display fresh wounds. This project is NWSFA's top priority during Coho migration and obtaining quality data to inform fisheries management decisions is the main objective.
