Country Christmas parade one of the best ever!

The town came out on Friday night, both to watch & participate in the annual Christmas light-up parade. The line-up in the marshalling area was 5 blocks long! Congratulations to everyone involved, it was a GREAT kick-off to the Christmas season.

Nicola Valley Hospital closed for 24 hrs

Saturday late afternoon, Interior Health announced that an Emergency Dept closure at the NV Hospital would take place from 8am yesterday Sunday, Nov. 26 to 8am this morning Monday, Nov. 27, due to limited physician availability. It was also sent as a notification through the Voyent Alert! app.

This is the first closure in Merritt since the BC Govt's commitment of \$7.5 million in permanent funding to help stabilize physician emergency-room coverage in Merritt, Salmon Arm & Oliver announced on October 18 — though there have been *many* since then for the South Okanagan General Hospital in Oliver.

TNRD increases tipping fees

Effective January 1, 2024, tipping fees will be increased on several waste streams.

Refuse/Garbage, Noxious Weeds, Small Dead Animals, and Commercial Recycling: Increase from \$80 per tonne to \$90 (this has not increased since January 2015).

Comingled Demolition, Renovation and Construction (DRC), Burned Material, and Land-Clearing Waste: Increase from \$160 per tonne to \$250/t (much of these comingled materials are less expensive to dispose of when they are separated).

Concrete/Asphalt: Increase from \$20 per tonne to \$30/t.

Asbestos Containing Material: Increase from \$230 per tonne to \$300/t.

TNRD solid waste facilities accept many materials free of charge that can be recycled and diverted from landfills, instead of being disposed of with regular garbage — household recycling, yard waste, mattresses & box springs, car batteries, tires, used oil, scrap metal, propane tanks, electronics, fridges, freezers & water coolers, clothing, paint, and small electrical appliances.
