2025, Int'l Year of Glacier Preservation Bridging Indigenous & western knowledge

Tim Patterson is an Indigenous Knowledge and Relations Advisor, the President of Mountain Culture on the board of directors of the Alpine Club of Canada, and has been appointed as one of the 2025 Int'l Year of Glacier Preservation (IYGP) Ambassadors designated by Global Institute for Water Security (GIWS) at the University of Saskatchewan.

Born in Merritt, Patterson is from the Lower Nicola Indian Band and has resided in Alberta for the last two decades. With a master's degree in environmental education, Patterson is focused on sharing Indigenous knowledge that is rooted in and around the mountains. Through Zuc'min Guiding, an Indigenous adventure tourism company, Patterson is able to connect with others.

"I want to bring my Indigenous knowledge, my western knowledge, and guiding together," said Patterson. "So, I use hiking and the outdoors as a way of breaking barriers and introducing people to knowledge construction."

GIWS at USask is joining many other water communities around the world in 2025 to celebrate and highlight the crucial role glaciers play in sustaining our planet's freshwater supply.

It will be raising awareness, promoting research, connecting and sharing events and art inspired by the year, and celebrating the earth's cryosphere – water in all its frozen forms.

The International Year of Glacier Preservation (IYGP) is a United Nations-led effort proposed by the President of the Republic of Tajikistan to raise awareness of the role glaciers play in our daily lives. The goal is to highlight the detrimental impacts of glacier recession around the world. Deglaciation, or the melting of glaciers, is a real threat that will impact communities throughout Canada.
