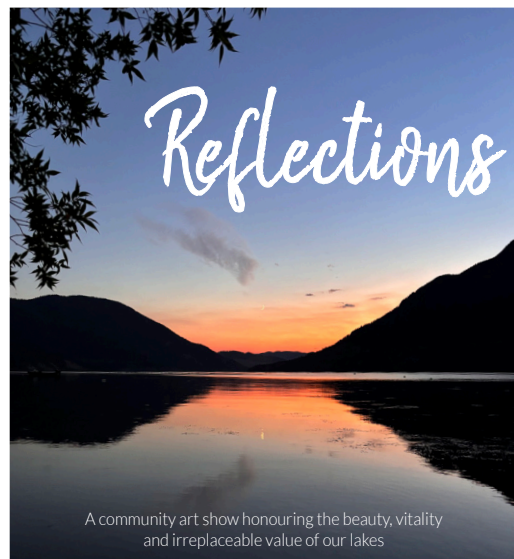

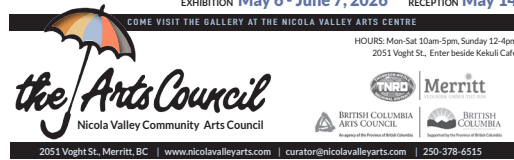

West Coast Corridor Resiliency Partnership

The Mayors of Merritt, Abbotsford, Chilliwack, Hope, and Princeton have joined together to create a new coordinated, multi-municipality initiative dedicated to strengthening Canada's economy and protecting and improving interprovincial and international trade through critical resiliency infrastructure investments.

The partnership comes out of the impact of the devastation from the 2021 and 2025 flooding events, which exposed critical vulnerabilities — and projections show these vulnerabilities increasing in the future.

The corridor is a critical link in Canada's national infrastructure system: transportation, energy, and food security. It is a nationally significant system that enables the movement of goods to global markets, the distribution of energy across provinces and beyond, and the continuity of agricultural production and food supply chains that Canadians depend on.

Mayor Goetz said: "While significant progress has been made through ongoing flood mitigation investments, critical funding gaps still remain across several key projects. Without continued senior government support to complete these interconnected resiliency initiatives, much of the work already undertaken risks being compromised during future flood events.

Merritt recognizes that long-term regional resilience depends on coordinated investment, partnership, and collaboration across all communities connected to these vital corridors."

The WCCRP initiative comes ahead of the upcoming Canadian Municipalities Conference in Edmonton June 4-7, where they hope to meet with municipal, provincial, and federal leaders.

Merritt Crown bike race

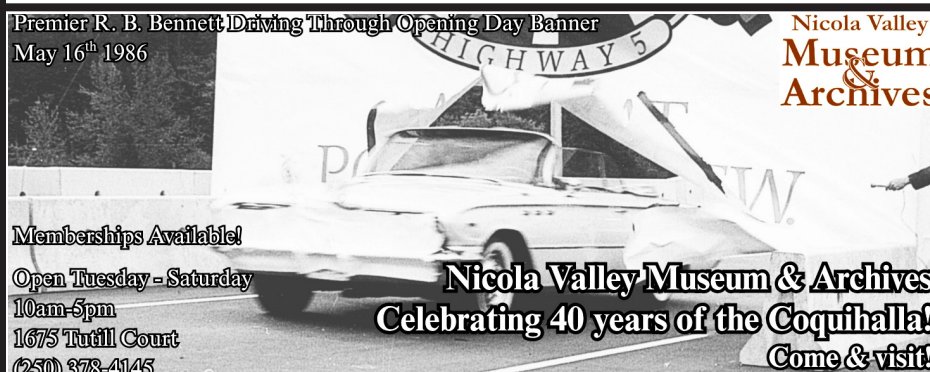

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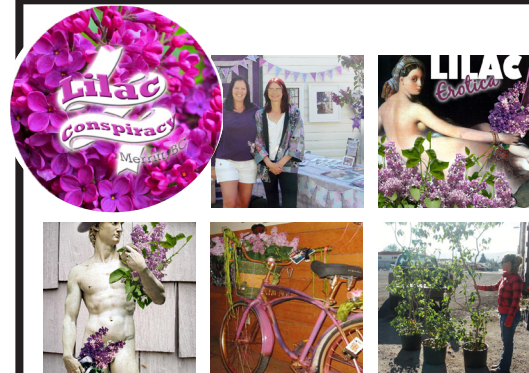

The Lilac Conspiracy
The Lilac Conspiracy was formed in 2003, in Merritt. The group, primarily resident artists, designers, educators & publishers, wanted to increase the awareness of the heritage lilac bushes which are abundant in the Nicola Valley. These were brought west by settlers, and planted when Europeans first came to the valley, from the mid-1800s to 1911 when Merritt was incorporated as a city. The heritage lilacs consist primarily of the common lilac (*Syringa vulgaris*), dark purple, and double white varieties.

Over the years, the Lilac Conspiracy has provided lilac slips from heritage plants, by donation, as an incentive to propagate them & continue the old stocks in the community.

Lilac Festivals in Merritt

The first lilac festival was held in 2004, in mid-May when the lilacs were bursting with colour & fragrance in Merritt. It was an art & music event in a heritage warehouse in the downtown area — a huge success with a Bohemian style. The event appealed to those who love the flowers & enjoy art. Festivals were held each year until 2008, but 'lilac awareness' has continued to be promoted through art posters during lilac time.

The Merritt Lilac Project

The Merritt Lilac Project began in 2005 with Bill Vander Zalm donating well-started 4'-5' lilac trees to the citizens of Merritt. Since that time, more than 5,000 lilacs have been planted in our community, thanks to his generosity. With this gift, the variety of lilac trees is greatly enhanced, extending the blooming season by at least 2 weeks. The bushes are young still, but continue thrive in our climate. They are an investment that will mature in the years to come!

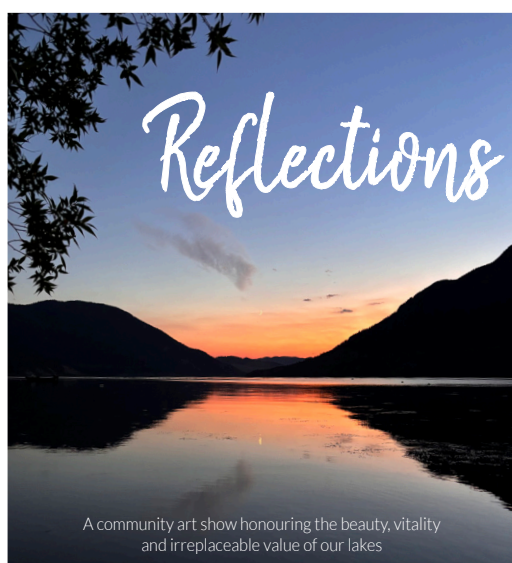

the voices of opposition sawed the air with cutting remarks.

"There's nothing wrong with the water system," said one. "Nah. The City always starts that bullshit when they're ready to make a grab," put in another.

"Same goes for the septic in Collettville. A lot of the tanks have sunk below the fields, because of wet grounds. All they have to do is raise their septic tanks. We don't need any million buck sewer system."

The Mirror asked one young homeowner what he thought of the province's grant covering 75% of costs for new sewers. "They can kiss my ass," he explained. "If the City takes over Collettville I'm moving out."

"Lissen," said a grizzled old pioneer, "soon's the City moves in, you got all kinds of rules and regulations and people comin' round to check what you're doin' ... inspectors tellin' you shit ... an' the first thing they tell you is you gotta do it right! So, right off the bat you start with a major disagreement."

"But," put in The Mirror, "don't, you want to do stuff right?"

"How I build my goddamn shed is my business," he shot back. "I don't need any bureaucrat tellin' me how many nails to put in a 2 by 4. Right depends on what kinda boards I got lyin' around."

(At this precise point The Mirror flashed, for some reason, on Indian attitudes then ... the light went out. So quick bright things come to, confusion, wot?)

So, clearly, there's dissension in Hooterville, and damned if the split doesn't seem to run along kind of class lines: those against joining the City seem to be the owners of lower valued properties; the yea vote seems to rest with owners of larger, higher valued properties.

Interestingly, if the amalgamation came about, taxes would go down for the low-priced properties; taxes would increase for the higher-priced properties. The dissenting group feels that their smaller properties would not increase in market value but that the higher-priced places would. The increased value of the latter would more than off-set increased taxes.

There you have it, dimly sketched like a message soaped on a Mirror, the human face of the Great Hooterville debate. For numbers, statistics and the establishment take, pick up the print-outs from City Hall. — Gordon Cockle, MMR #33, 1995
