**Saw Creek all-clear**  
All evacuation orders & alerts issued by the TNRD and the Village of Lytton due to the Saw Creek Wildfire have been downgraded to *all clear*, effective yesterday at 5pm. This all clear notice affects approximately 230 addressed properties in Electoral Areas "I" (Blue Sky Country) and the Village of Lytton.

The BC Wildfire Service now has the Saw Creek wildfire listed as "Under Control." This reflects significant progress made through sustained suppression efforts by ground crews and aviation resources. Crews will remain on-site to continue patrols and extinguish hot spots. www.drivebc.ca shows Hwy 1 open.

**Property taxes & homeowner grant**

Property tax notices were mailed out in mid-May, and municipal property taxes must be received by the City no later than 4:30pm on Wednesday, July 2. Payments not received will be subject to a penalty of 10% for the current year.

The City strongly encourages homeowners to claim the BC Homeowner Grant and pay the municipal tax bill early. If residents fail to claim the Homeowner Grant by the due date, the 10% penalty will be applied to the entire amount without considering the grant amount. This penalty cannot be adjusted later. There are lots of payment options, though it might already be too late for online banking payment. You can pay in person by visiting City Hall 8:30am-4:30pm (closed for lunch 12:00-1:15pm), Mon-Fri, except Statutory Holidays. FMI www.merritt.ca/propertytax/
