Ainslie Creek wildfire update

The Anderson Creek wildfire that started July 21, south of Boston Bar, has been removed from the BC Wildfire Service map, and the entire fire area east of the Fraser River is now referred to as the Ainslie Creek wildfire. As of last evening, it covers 30,085.9 hectares, and is still out of control.

The Brunswick Creek and Ainslie Creek wildfires remain active on either side of the canyon but are not currently growing at a significant rate. Both fires are burning on steep slopes, where ground crews cannot safely access the fire's edge.

Northeast sector of the wildfire, closest to Merritt

Crews are working along the Edgar, Teepee Creek and Prospect Forest Service Roads to hold the fire perimeter along these existing control lines. They have been taking advantage of the brief downturn in fire behaviour to reinforce these lines and anchor points, establishing safe access ahead of the increased fire behaviour expected this week.

Heavy equipment is working to establish contingency lines a safe distance from the fire perimeter, in anticipation of increased fire behaviour.

A warming and drying trend reestablish tomorrow and strengthens through Friday — and given the overall hot and dry conditions, BC Wildfire Service still expects fire behaviour to increase this week.

On July 17, at 6:15 p.m., on Hwy 97C near Elkhart, a grey Toyota sedan was stopped for excessive speed when a BC Highway Patrol laser showed a reading of 172 km/h in a 110 zone.

"The driver told police that he and his girlfriend were on an overnight test-drive from Vancouver to Kelowna," said Sergeant Michael McLaughlin with BC Highway Patrol. "The vehicle successfully demonstrated that it can speed and that it fits on the back of a tow truck."

Regardless of the reason for the road trip, the 30-year-old Vancouver driver was issued:

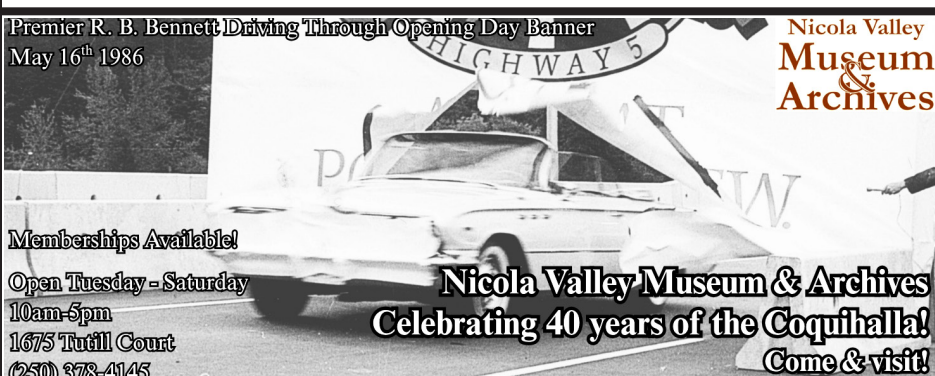
A ticket for excessive speed (over 60 km/h), section 148(1) of the BC Motor Vehicle Act, with a fine of \$483;
The cost of a tow truck (for the driver) and a seven-day impound (which is the responsibility of the Registered Owner),

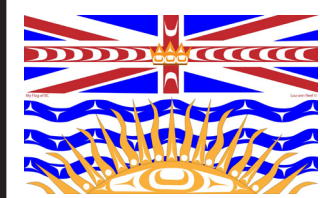

1926 a big year for forest fires

100 years ago, in 1926, BC and the Merritt area were hit with a series of forest fires. There was a great deal of hope at the start of the year, 1925 had been a disastrous year for forest fires in the country, and the hope was that better public awareness would keep the fires to a minimum...

The first major fire that happened in the Valley that year was the Canford Mills Fire in May 1926. The fire was believed to be caused by faulty electrical wiring. The fire quickly ripped through the mill, destroying it before the fire departments were able to reach the mill. The fire also kicked up embers that drifted across the valley, starting six fires between Canford and Merritt, all of which were quickly extinguished, but the *Herald* noted that many residents kept a vigilant eye out all night looking for any other fires that might’ve started.

As the heat and drought of the summer began to take hold, the forests around the Nicola Valley became primed for fire. A series of small fires began to appear in the middle of July, but as the Nicola Valley’s winds picked up, the series of fires soon got out of control. One fire began near Kingsvale, believed to have been started by a spark from the rail line, and quickly grew as the wind pushed it down towards Voght Valley. Another fire was started at McKenzie Lake, believed to have been started by a cigarette tossed out of a vehicle. There were also a series of fires near Pot Hole Lake, as well as fires near Blackburn and Coalmont which threatened the mining communities. As these fires burned the city of Merritt was blanketed in smoke so dense that it obscured the hills surrounding town.

Every employee from the lumber mills and the coal mines, as well as every available man were called out to fight these fires. Construction was halted or greatly slowed as workers filed out to fight the fires across the valley, and similarly, ranchers began struggling to find people to employ for the haying season. This happened because the government had the authority to draft firefighters from civilians and not complying with the order levied a fine. This happened during the 1926 fire season when four men, William Lawson, Alex Reid, Daniel Sullivan, and P. Welsh were rounded up for not reporting to fire camp, and each received a \$25 fine (nearly \$450 in today’s money).
